


Tell Me Why

This is a sweet, sweet song that works for Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, and Grandparents' Day. I added the descant-y part to help you stretch it out a bit.

Suggestions for the Form:

Sing the melody in unison.

Sing the melody on a neutral syllable or light hum while the decant is sung. Put both parts together.

I think a light touch with **accompaniment** would be best. (You know--a little less Liberace and a little more James Taylor.)

If you'd like to incorporate **barred instruments**, you might want to use the interlude on the following page.



If you opt to use the interlude, keep that nice, light touch in the unpitched. If you don't have a chime tree, use your best finger cymbals or triangle. If your claves date back to the Spanish Armada, then just use a nice wood block.

This interlude could double as the introduction, too.

We all know this, but the MIT (most important thing) really is the sweet singing of the children's voices.
